### **Outcomes for children in receipt of Pupil Premium 2018-2019**

#### **Children receiving Pupil Premium Grant from Reception to Year 5**

Outstanding, enhanced progress for the majority of children in receipt of pupil premium in reading, writing and maths:

- In reading 85% of children made accelerated progress from the previous year and end of Key Stage, with 97% making at least good progress.
- In writing 20% of children made accelerated progress from the previous year and end of Key Stage, with 100% making at least good progress.
- In maths 65% of children made accelerated progress from the previous year and end of Key Stage, with 100% making at least good progress.

### **Children receiving Pupil Premium Grant in Year 6 2018/19 (3 pupils)**

#### Attainment and progress

- 67% achieved at least the expected standard in writing
- 67% achieved Greater Depth in writing
- 100% achieved at least the expected standard for the end of KS2 in SPAG
- 67 % achieved a high scaled score in SPAG
- 67% achieved at least the expected standard in reading
- 67% achieved the higher attainment band in reading
- 67% made at least expected progress in reading
- 100% achieved at least the expected standard in maths
- 67 % achieved greater depth in maths

### **Outcomes for all pupils (Year 6 end of Keystage tests)**

98% achieved at east expected standard in RWM combined

36% of pupils achieved a high scaled score/greater depth in RWM combined

53% of pupils achieved the higher standard in reading

62% of pupils achieved a high score in maths

58% achieved GDS in writing
